#### C. A-OK Program & School Climate





# 5TH GRADE PARENT ORIENTATION



- While you will not be able to make a specific team request, you may send a note or an email to Mr. Kurz (mkurz@ofcs.net) describing your child in terms of learning style preferences and personality traits so that we may be able to match him/her with the best possible fit in terms of our 6th grade teaching teams. Please send your note or email to Mr. Kurz by Friday, May 9, or we will not be able to consider your request. Please understand our need to finalize our class lists in a timely manner.
- Your child took two math placement tests in March, which will be used in conjunction with his/her math grade and teacher recommendation o determine if your child will be placed in 6th grade math or advanced math. You will be notified by June 13 via US Mail of your child's team placement, team supply list, and math course placement for the 2014-2015 school year.
- Clothing and accessories prohibited under OFMS Dress Code policy include:
  - Tee shirts or other clothing items that include drug, alcohol, or tobacco messages
  - Excessively low cut shirts
  - Tee shirts or other clothing items that endorse illegal, racist, sexist, violent, bigoted, or gang-related activity
  - Tee shirts or other clothing that displays sexually suggestive comments or causes a disruption to the educational process
  - Tank Tops (All shirts must have sleeves, which extend over the shoulder)
  - Cut offs and lycra/spandex "bike" shorts
  - Apparel that is backless or exposes the midriff
  - Hats/Headwear/Bandannas
  - Pajama Tops/Bottoms
  - Excessively short skirts and shorts
  - Shorts, skirts, dresses, etc., with a slit above the mid-thigh
  - Stressed, frayed, torn, tattered, or unhemmed clothing
  - Tape on clothing
  - Fishnet tights
  - Face paint
  - Artificially colored hair
  - · Belt, waist, wallet, wrist, or neck chains
  - Shoes with wheels ("heelies")
  - Dark glasses (unless prescribed by a doctor)
  - Written graffiti on clothing
  - Facial/body piercing
  - Anything else considered inappropriate for school.
  - Shorts, if appropriate, may be worn to school.
  - Shorts, pants, or any other type of clothing should not fall below the waistline.
  - Yoga pants and leggings may be worn as long as the student is wearing a shirt that is at least mid-thigh length.
  - Clothing should not be excessively large or small.
  - Clothing should not expose undergarments.
  - Clothing or accessories, which may be dangerous to other students, or to school property, are not permitted.
- Mr. Kurz and Mrs. Kotecki will make the final decision on whether or not an article of clothing is appropriate.
- Students will be assigned to a lunch table after the first week of school. During the first week of school, students may work out table arrangements with their friends. Mrs. Kotecki and our lunch staff will assist the students with this process. If problems arise during the school year, students must approach Mrs. Kotecki to work out a possible table change. We have found this format of assigned tables reduces conflicts between students at lunch in terms of isolation and exclusion. In addition, it enables our lunch staff to hold the students more accountable for their table and area clean up and for their behavior in general.
- We no longer go to Cuyahoga Valley Environmental Education Center (CVEEC) as an overnight experience in 7th grade.
   We felt that the combined cost of the CVEEC trip and the Washington DC trip in 8th grade was a financial burden for families.



# **Guidance Program & Services**

Welcome to the 2014-2015 school year. We would like to introduce ourselves as your child's school counselors. Our names are Mrs. Kathy Suvak and Mrs. Christine Palmer. We are licensed individuals available to you, your child and your child's teacher throughout the school year. This year will bring many social and academic changes in your child's life. Most of these changes will be met positively and will be wonderful learning experiences. However, occasionally there may be times when a child needs guidance in dealing with these changes. - Post a study and activity schedule; devote some time to each subject

#### **HOMEWORK**

- Have your child do homework each night at a specific place and time
- Write long term assignments on monthly calendars
- Look over homework after your child is finished and be accessible for questions

#### SCHOOL CONTACT

Keep close contact with your child's teacher; you do not have to wait for a conference to talk to school personnel (teacher, counselor, and nurse)

If concerns or questions arise throughout the year, please do not hesitate to call. We are here to assist both you and your child.

Dear Parents of 5th Grade Students:

We are very excited that your child will be attending Olmsted Falls Middle School. We look forward to meeting your child at our *WEB 6th Grade Orientation*, which will be held from 8:00 AM-12:30 PM on Monday, August 18, 2014. Our school is participating in a transition initiative called *Where Everybody Belongs* (WEB), which is a program whose sole purpose is to help sixth graders feel more comfortable, as well as help them achieve success in their first year of middle school. While we will be doing classroom presentations this week, we are not going to be bringing the students over to the middle school until August.

The WEB sixth grade orientation and transition program is designed to both welcome and support sixth graders by assigning them an 8th grade WEB Leader as a mentor during their 6th grade year. This WEB Leader is a responsible 8th grade student who was hand-selected from a large pool of applicants and has met the qualifications of being a good role model and a positive leader at our school. Following is some information to let you know what you and your student can expect in advance of his or her tirst day of school:

- 1) Your child can expect to receive an invitation to our *WEB 6th Grade Orientation Day* in the mail. If he or she has not received the invitation by August 8, 2014, please call the main office at 440-427-6200 to let us know.
- 2) A day or two before the *WEB 6th Grade Orientation* your child will also receive a phone call from her or his WEB Leader personally inviting her or him to orientation day and giving the details of where to be and what time.
- 3) Your child should <u>not</u> bring backpacks, purses or other like items on August 18 as the day is quite active and they will be moving around a great deal.
- 4) Please make sure that your child wears comfortable clothing and shoes that do not restrict movement. Please do not wear baseball caps or any other hats.

The *WEB 6th Grade Orientation* is a <u>student-only</u> function; therefore, we want your child to attend on her/his own. Since this is an orientation program which will assist your child as she/he transitions to the middle school, your child's attendance and participation is required. Students will receive their locker assignment and schedule at this orientation program.

Following the *WEB* 6<sup>th</sup> *Grade Orientation*, we will have the 6<sup>th</sup> *Grade Open Campus* from 12:30-3:00. This event is for both parents and students. Students and their parents will be able to load their lockers and follow their schedule to locate all of their classes.

Our 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Parent Information Night, which will be held on Wednesday, August 13, 2014 from 7:00-8:00 PM, is for parents only. Parents will receive important information from their child's teachers.

## Top Ten Questions Most Frequently Asked by Parents of 5th Grade Students

- ➤ The following information has been provided in an effort to answer some of the questions that you may have regarding your coming to Olmsted Falls Middle School for 6<sup>th</sup> grade.
- 1. What time does school start?

The school day will begin at 8:20 AM each day. Homeroom will begin at 8:30 AM.

2. What time does school end?

School is dismissed at 3:30 PM each day.

3. Where do we get off and on the bus?

The bus will drop students off and pick them up right in front of the building.

4. Where do parents drop students off or pick them up in the event they have to do so?

Parents may drop off or pick up their children outside of the building by the Wheel hallway.

5. Are students allowed to walk to school?

No.

6. What do students need to bring to school on the first day?

You will receive a sixth grade supply list in the mail by June 13. All the supplies that are needed for the first day will be listed on the supply list.

7. When do 6th graders eat lunch?

Sixth graders eat lunch from 12:36-1:06 PM.

Our cafeteria has a variety of selections to choose from and students may bring their lunch and purchase items separately, as well. There is usually 10-15 minutes of time left after students eat their lunch. You may either go outside to our playground area or play in the gym.

### 8. Will I have my own locker?

Each of you will have your own locker which has a built in combination lock.

## 9. What do I do if I am not able to open my locker?

If you are not able to open your locker you need to come to the main office for help.

### 10. How long are my classes and how much time do I have in between classes?

Each class is 44 minutes long and you will have 4 minutes in between each of your classes.
