When you come to the Middle School next year, you will be required to take band, choir, or band and choir. We thought it would be helpful to know a little more about the classes. These are commonly asked questions by fifth graders:

1. Do I have to come in early, stay late, or give up recess time to be in choir or band at the middle school?

No. You will be scheduled into band and choir the same way you will be scheduled into math, science, language arts, gym, etc. Band and choir meet during the regular school day.

- 2. How many concerts do we have? 2 3 per year
- 3. Does our grade in choir and band count in our grade point average? Yes. Most students earn A's and B's in choir and band.
- 4. Do I have to sing by myself in choir?
 Only if you would like to. In sixth grade, you'll sometimes sing privately for the teacher to test your highest and lowest notes. Solo opportunities are available to those who are interested.
- 5. I was not in fifth grade band. May I still join sixth grade band?

 Yes. However, 6-8 instrument lessons over the summer are recommended to help you catch up and to avoid frustration.
- I was not in fifth grade choir or have never been in choir before. May I still join sixth grade choir?
 Yes! Middle School choir is designed to fit your changing and untrained voice. You'll quickly catch up.
- 7. I would like to be in choir and band in sixth grade. May I do this? Yes! We offer this option to our most dedicated students.
