Bus Rules

RESPONSIBLE

- Keep all belongings to yourself
- Sit in your assigned seat

RESPECTFUL

- Use appropriate language/tone
- Treat others with kindness and compassion
- Follow directions given by adult.

SAFE

- Keep hands and feet to yourself and inside the bus
- Face forward seated, with your feet on the ground





ARRIVAL and DEPARTURE

RESPONSIBLE

• Arrival:

Go directly to your assigned entrance area

- Departure:
- Go directly to your bus

RESPECTFUL

- Use appropriate language
- Treat others with kindness, compassion and respect

Homeroom

RESPONSIBLE

• Attendance is taken by 8:30 AM. If you are not in your seat by the 8:30 bell, you are considered late

RESPECTFUL

- Students are to be respectful of their country during the Pledge to the American Flag.
- Please remain quiet and listen during ALL announcements.
 SAFE
- Students should not be wandering the hallway from 8:20-8:30



Lockers



RESPONSIBLE

A shut locker should have nothing hanging out.
Do not rig your locker in order to keep the lock open.
RESPECTFUL

- •No tape, streamers, candy or balloons attached to lockers.
- •Do not kick or slam your locker.

SAFE

• Lockers are the property of the Board of Education and subject to inspection at the school's discretion.







RESPECTFUL

Please use the back hook to avoid jamming/damage

RESPONSIBLE/SAFE

Backpacks must remain in lockers throughout the school day



Hallway

RESPONSIBLE

- Take all materials needed for your classes from your locker and go where you need to go!
- Keep locker and hallway clean

RESPECTFUL

- Use appropriate language/tone.
- Treat others with kindness, compassion and respect

SAFE

- *Walk* on the right side of the hallway and *focus*!
- Keep hands and feet to yourself







RESPONSIBLE

Meet all expectations-Be your own JUDGE! RESPECTFUL

- Dress in a fashion that is appropriate for SCHOOL
- Respond to staff appropriately
- SAFE
- Remain clean, neat and well-groomed



Dress Code

- Tee Shirts or other clothing items that include inappropriate content or that will cause a disruption
- Shorts, if appropriate, may be worn to school.
- Shorts, pants, or any other type of clothing should not fall below the waistline.
- Clothing should not be excessively large or small.
- Clothing should not expose undergarments.
- Clothing and accessories, which may be dangerous to other students, or to school property are NOT permitted.

ALSO PROHIBITED ARE:

- Tank Tops
- Tight yoga pants unless covered to your **thigh** by a long shirt.
- Cut off shorts of any kind and lycra/spandex "bike shorts."
- Apparel that exposes the midriff
- Hats/Hatwear (unless approved by the principal).
- Excessively short and/or tight skirts
- Torn, tattered, or un-hemmed clothing.
- Anything else considered inappropriate for school.





Cafetorium

RESPONSIBLE

- Efficiently take lunch to your assigned seat
- Maintain a clean eating area

RESPECTFUL

- Use appropriate language/tone
- Treat others with kindness and compassion
- Raise your hand and wait to be called upon before leaving your seat

SAFE

- Enter/Exit in an appropriate fashion
- Keep hands/feet to yourself at all times





Technology Responsible

- -Use for educational purposes only
- Use appropriate language
- Respectful
 - -Respect the work of peers
 - Take care of the electronic devices

Safe

– Only use electronic devices in classrooms at teachers' discretion



Clinic Rules



RESPONSIBLE

Library

RESPONSIBLE

• Students may visit the library before school at 8:20 a.m., during STAR, or during class with a pass

RESPECTFUL

• The rules for the library are the same as in the classroom.

SAFE

• Library assistants have the same authority as a classroom teacher.



Emergency Drills



RESPONSIBLE

- Stay with your class. RESPECTFUL
- Follow ALL directions given the first time.
- Respond to staff appropriately

SAFE

• All students are to remain silent in and out of the building during a fire drill.



Field Trips

- All school rules apply during any field trip.
- Students may be excluded from a trip due to poor behavior/grades here at school.

-8th grade students only - 25 point system

Gum, Candy and Food

 Automatic Detention if caught chewing gum.

Skipping Class

- Skipping class is PROHIBITED.
- Cutting or Skipping class is defined as:
 - Not attending class
 - Not checked in with a teacher
 - Leaving class without permission

If you are considered skipping class your parents will be contacted and disciplinary consequences will follow



Bullying and Harassment

Bully-like behavior will not be tolerated! Repeated offenses over time

- <u>Verbal</u>: Teasing, name calling, insulting, threatening, taunting, etc.
- <u>Physical</u>: Booking, hitting, shoving, grabbing, punching, slapping, taking or hiding belongings, damaging property, etc.
- <u>Psychological</u>: Blackmailing, tormenting, gesturing, spreading rumors, gossiping, etc.

Detentions

Detentions may be assigned for academic and/or disciplinary reasons at the discretion of the classroom teacher or administrator.

- <u>Written Notice</u>: to be signed by the parent and returned to the staff member assigning the detention.
- Failing to Serve Detention: All detentions are to be served on the date of the infraction.
 - If a student receives more than one detention in a single day, the student has the responsibility to inform the assigning teachers of the conflict and re-schedule a date to serve.
- <u>FAILURE TO SERVE A DETENTION</u> WILL RESULT in a 2 hour Saturday Detention. After the third missed Saturday Detention, any further detentions may result in suspension from school.
- <u>Saturday Detention</u>: Based on the behavior, a 2 or 3 hour Saturday Detention may be assigned. Failure to serve a Saturday Detention will result in an AUTOMATIC out – of – school suspension.



Suspensions

- The Administration reserves the right to follow DUE PROCESS for all students.
- If you are suspended you may not be on school grounds or attend after school activities.
- You are permitted to make up your work but it is your responsibility to speak to your teacher.




Athletic Eligibility
