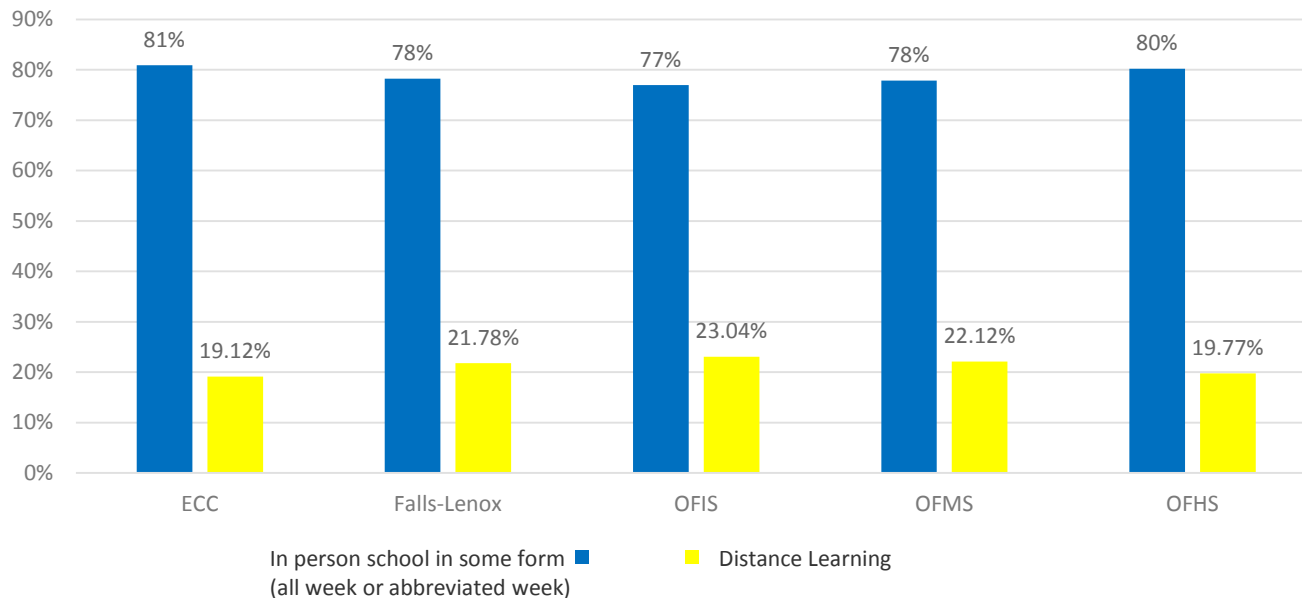

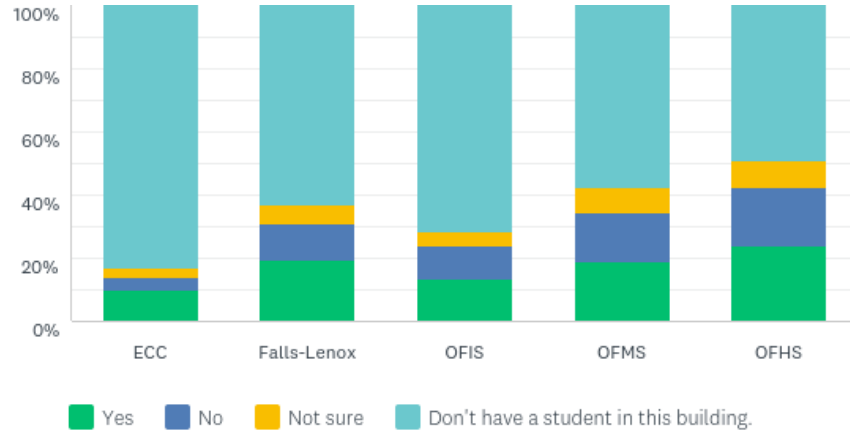

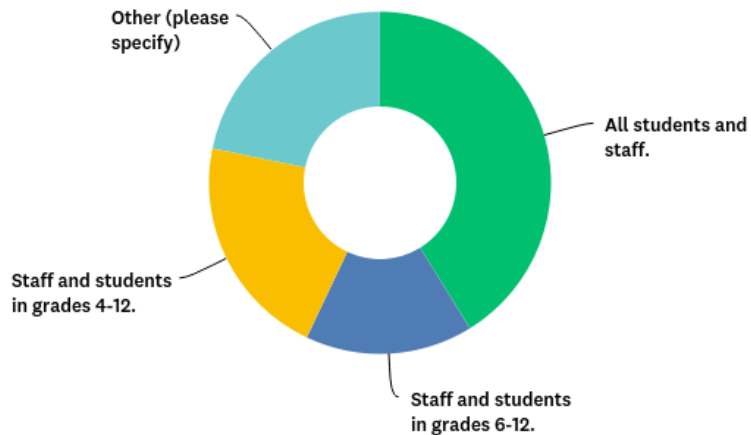

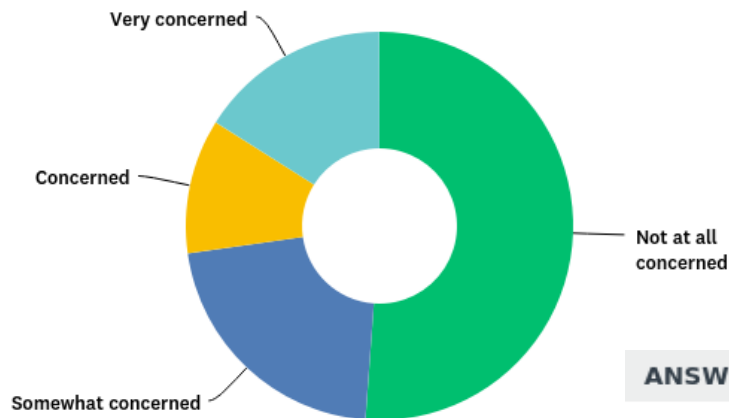

Q5: As you consider next school year, how concerned are you about securing child care?

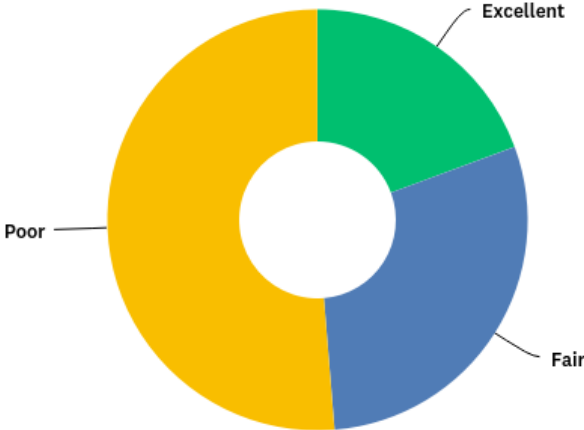

Q6: Option 1: The district would not be able to convene in-person classes for all students, everyday. As a result, distance learning will be used fully. What is your opinion of this option?

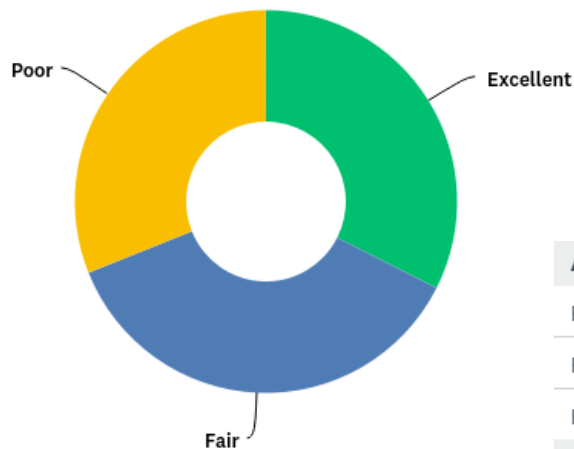

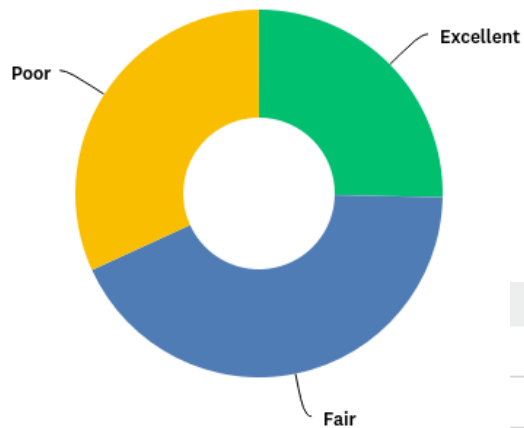

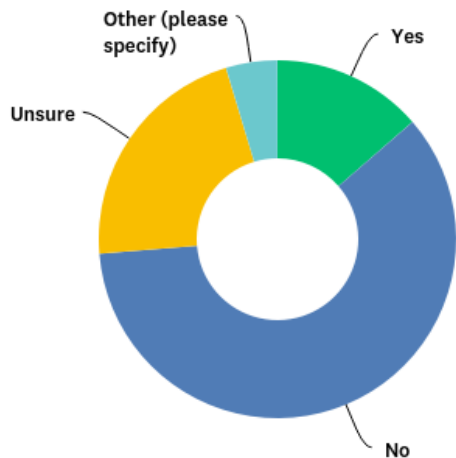

Q9: Option 4: I would like a distance learning option for my student(s) until there is a vaccine. I do not want to send my student to school.

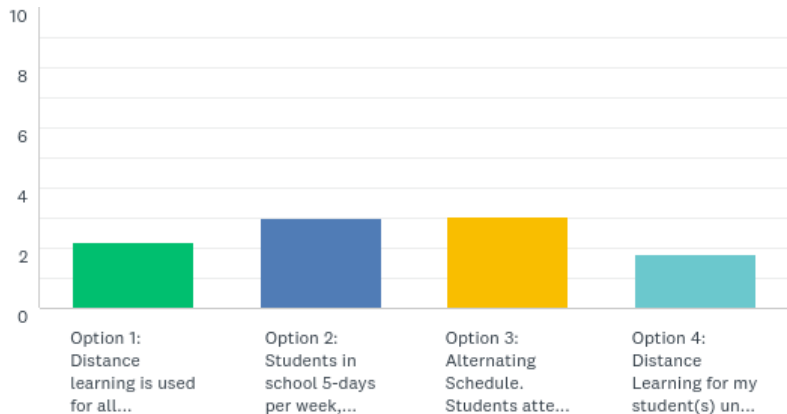

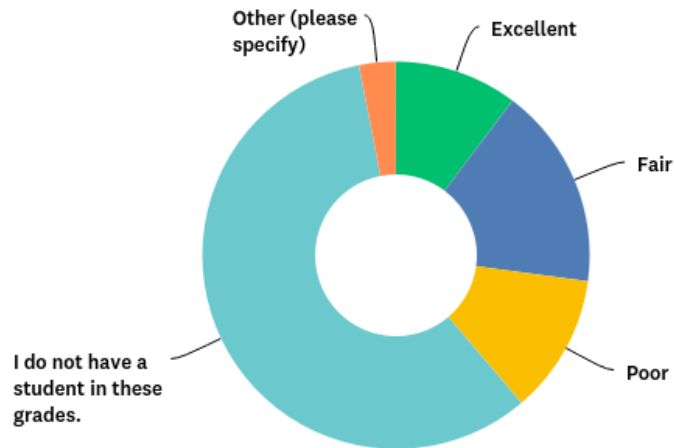

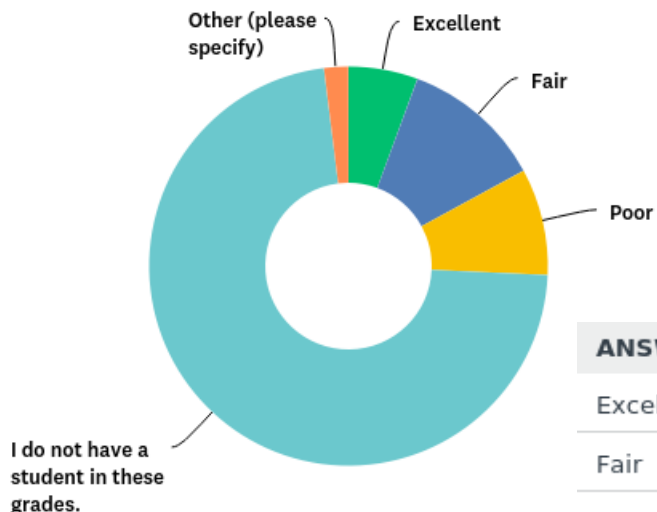

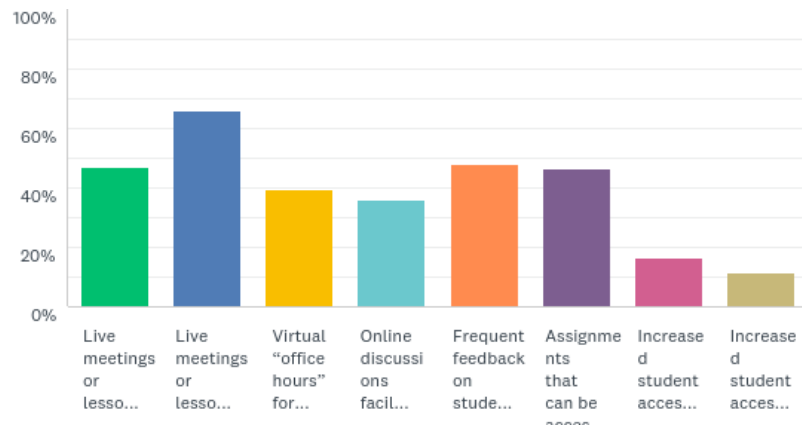

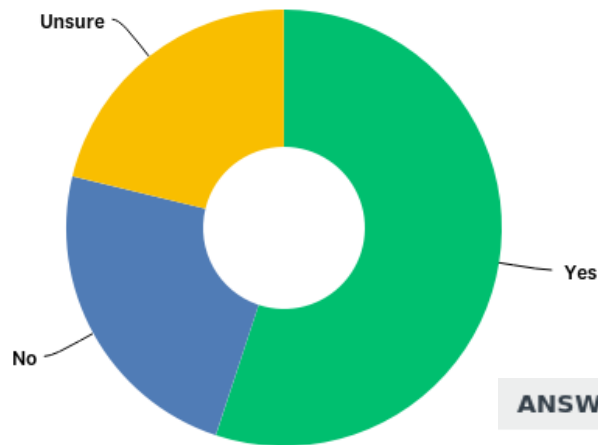

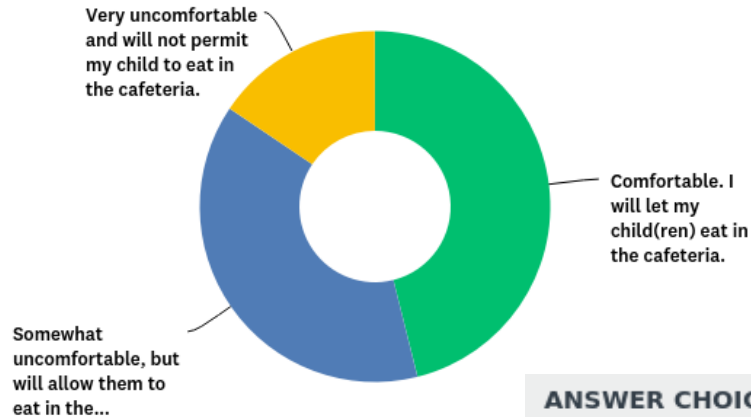

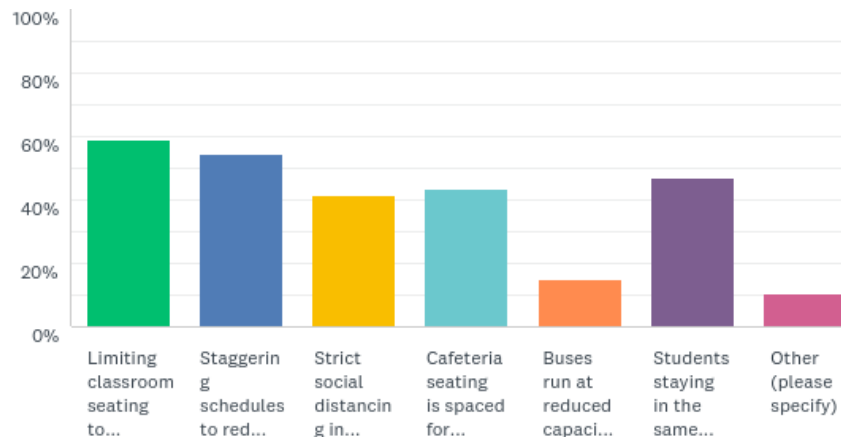

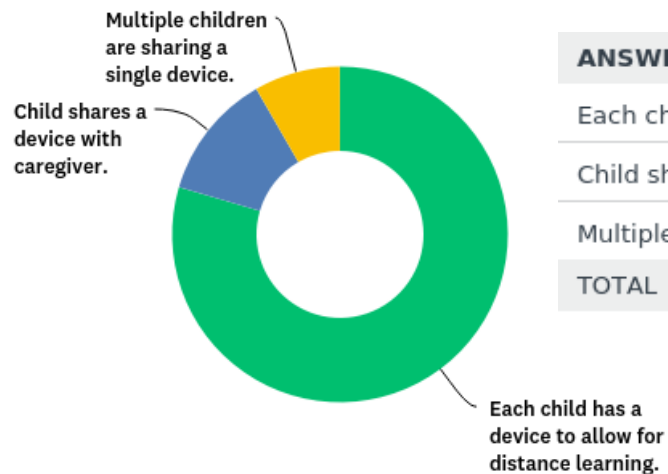

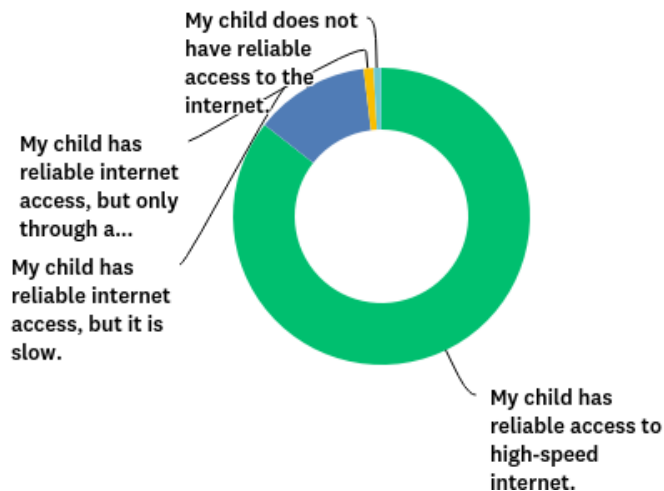

Q18: What best describes your child's typical internet access?

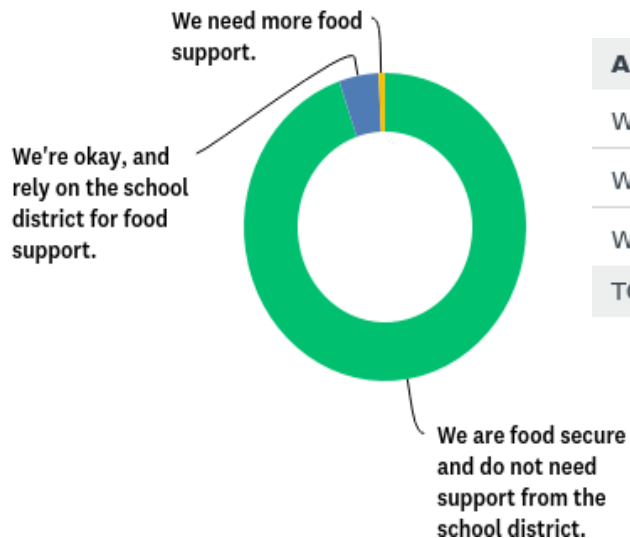

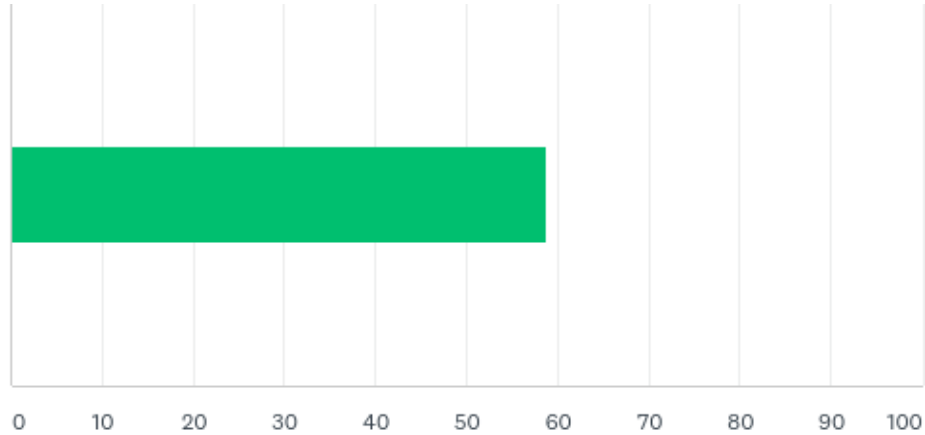

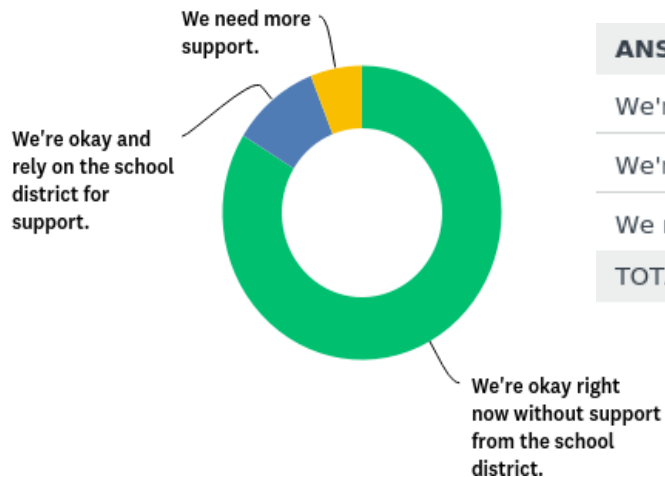
Q20: Thinking about your children, how concerned are you about their social or emotional well-being?
