I come before snow but after leaves fall, I stay through winter but leave before spring. I cling to windows, roofs and grass. What Am I?


I make you think as you read me, wondering my answer. I can be weird or wacky or maybe make no sense. I can even make you laugh. What Am I?




What is Your Favorite Thing to Do at Recess? By: Leah P.






What's Your Favorite Color? By: Livia G.
